8. Description:	The procurement of Equipment, Fixtures and Equipment for the Medical and Wellness Services Building is part of a unified proposal for the construction of the latter in the total amount of P115,000,000.00. The exclusion of this part in the FY 2027 Tier 1 ceiling resorted to its resubmission for the Tier 2. The procurement of these equipment, fixtures and equipment are necessary in order to optimized its usage according to its intended purpose. The proposed construction of Medical and Wellness Services Building at MSU-Tawi-Tawi College of Technology and Oceanography is a high-impact institutional project designed to address the critical lack of accessible healthcare services in Tawi-Tawi. Currently, the University operates a small infirmary which can no longer respond adequately to the health needs of its growing academic population, now numbering more than 6,000 students, faculty, and staff. MSU-TCTO is in Barangay Sanga-Sanga, Municipality of Bongao, around 9 kilometers from the town center, where the lone government hospital — the Datu Halun Sakilan Memorial Hospital — is situated. That facility remains a 25-bed Level I hospital, serving the province's total population of 440,276 (PSA, 2020), including 116,118 residents in Bongao. The combination of geographic isolation, hospital overcrowding, and population growth necessitates a dedicated university-based medical facility. The proposed Medical Center will improve MSU-TCTO's ability to deliver primary and emergency healthcare to its constituents and to the surrounding community. It also supports long-term academic development goals of introducing allied health programs in a province that currently offers none.										
9. Purpose:	The purpose of the MSU-TCTO Medical Center is diverse. It is designed to prepare for and respond to the University's growing population and specifically addresses the medical and dental needs of students, faculty, and staff. In addition, the medical center will be established to anticipate the opening of medical degrees and other related programs in 2028. One of the primary purposes of the medical center is to address the shortage of medical professionals in the province. By providing comprehensive health services and facilities, the Center aims to produce competent health professionals who can contribute to meeting the health needs of the province. Additionally, the medical center will play a critical role in improving the university's overall healthcare infrastructure. It will serve as a hub for medical services and house medical wards, laboratories, a pharmacy, administrative offices, and other medical and support service facilities. This ensures that the university community has easy access to quality healthcare services.										
10. Beneficiaries:	The establishment of the MSU-TCTO Medical Center will benefit various groups of people. The primary beneficiaries will primarily be MSU-TCTO students, faculty, and staff. The medical center provides convenient access to comprehensive healthcare services and addresses your medical and dental needs. This ensures that they receive quality healthcare on campus, which promotes their overall well-being and supports their academic pursuits. The local community will also benefit from the medical center. By addressing the shortage of medical professionals in the province, the center will help improve health care for residents. It will improve the availability and accessibility of medical care and positively impact community health outcomes. In addition, the establishment of the medical center will benefit the entire province. By educating and training competent medical professionals, it will help address the shortage of healthcare professionals in the region. This will lead to improved health services, better health infrastructure, and an overall improvement in the health system in the province.

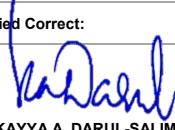
